The Lenten Season has passed, and we have celebrated Resurrection Day on Easter Sunday. It is hard to realize how fast the time passed from Ash Wednesday to Easter. I still have some notes on my desk from planning for the Ash Wednesday service.

As a church we have come together for two combined services, we have enjoyed our traditional hymns, seen the various decorations throughout the Lenten Season, and enjoyed special music. It always is a blessing to be able to come together as a church family

and take part in some of the special occasions during this season.

One thing we did not experience this season at either church was an increase in our worship attendance. what the church needs to do to attract a newer crowd to not only come to church but to take an active part. Music seems to play a big part with debate between contemporary music versus traditional, choirs or praise bands, enhanced sound systems, and I am sure others that I am not aware of right now.
